Mankind has often made decisions about species they consider pests without first carefully considering the effects that their choices could have on the ecosystem. This story is not unique and has repeated itself in many different countries. It usually plays out the same way: some creature is either spreading a disease or eating food that is being grown for human consumption. Then, another creature is brought in to control the problem species. That creature, in turn, quickly ends up becoming the next big problem. The mosquitofish is a perfect example of this situation.

About a century ago, mosquitos were spreading diseases like malaria and causing the deaths of numerous people. To control the mosquito population, people introduced a species known as the mosquitofish. This fish eats mosquito larvae—babies that hatch from the egg. However, they're not the only things that mosquitofish like to eat. They also bite off the fins of other fish and tadpoles—the larvae of frogs, leaving them to sink to the bottom and die. The problem is so bad in Australia that several varieties of frogs have been placed on the threatened species list.

Hope has not been lost though. Scientists and engineers have worked together to develop a robot fish that the mosquitofish in the laboratory find absolutely terrifying. This robot fish looks and moves just like a predator of the mosquitofish and frightens them so much that they can't breed effectively. The research results have been very promising thus far.
